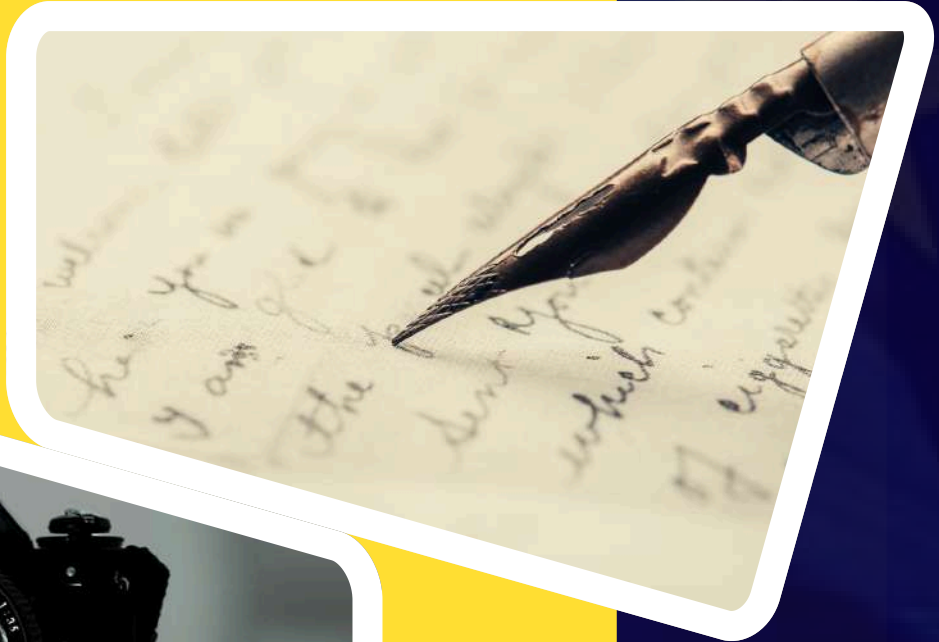

CONTEXT



WHAT FUTURE FOR THE EUROPEAN CONTINENT?

The map of the European Union is **changing**. Countries that once stood outside the EU are **now at its doorstep**, and the decisions made in the coming years will **shape the continent for generations**.

Yet, in some states, enlargement is framed as a charity, a risk, a burden, and that is the version being handed to people by those who **benefit from keeping the EU small and divided**. In others, it is not even a discussion point.

Either way, the average citizen is left with the same question: why should I want this, and what's in it for me?

TEPSA's contest "**What future for the European continent?**" is an invitation to change that. **Whatever your background, wherever you are from, if you have a vision for what Europe could become, we want to hear it.**



CONTEST

We welcome submissions in three categories:

WRITTEN ESSAYS

Original written essays (maximum 2000 words) should respond to **one** of the three guiding questions:

- ☆ How can a wider European Union contribute to Europe's security and resilience?
- ☆ How can enlargement help build a more competitive and self-sufficient European continent?
- ☆ How can enlargement create tangible benefits for everyday citizens in both current and future Member States?

POETRY

Original poems should explore, **in your own voice, what a wider European Union could mean** for Europe's security, competitiveness, or its citizens.

Poems should not exceed 500 words, reflecting the author's own ideas and creativity.

AUDIOVISUAL

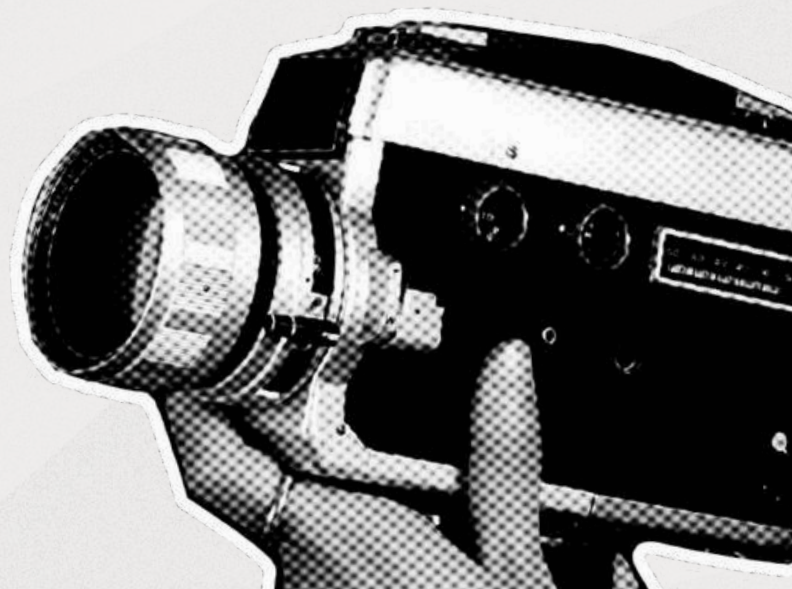
Original audiovisual pieces should be up to 2 minutes in length.

We welcome **all formats** (e.g. interviews, vlogs, animation, or other creative video formats), and submissions **can be recorded with any equipment** you have.

You may appear in the video yourself, feature other participants, or rely entirely on visuals, narration, or animation.

Videos should be submitted as a video file or via a downloadable link.

Your submission should engage with the theme of Europe's future and/or EU enlargement.

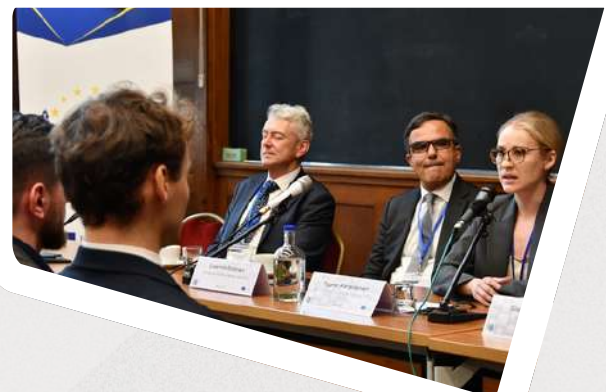
